Tabbing

Using Web Browser Internet Explorer 7 and Computer Operating System Windows XP SP2 Home Edition or Windows Vista Home Premium

- STEP 1. Open Internet Explorer 7 by clicking your cursor arrow on the "Start" button located in the bottom left corner of your desktop to open the "Start" menu. Your home page will automatically load on the first tab.
- STEP 2. To open another tab while keeping your current tab open, simply click your cursor arrow on the second tab located just to the right of the first tab.
- STEP 3. A second tab will appear labeled "Blank Page." "About:blank" will appear in the address bar. Type in the website address of the site you want to visit. Both tabs will be visible.
- STEP 4. To close a tab, simply click on the "X" located on the right side of the tab.
- STEP 5. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to open additional websites.

Opening Multiple Tabs at Startup

Using Web Browser Internet Explorer 7 and Computer Operating System Windows XP SP2 Home Edition or Windows Vista Home Premium

- STEP 1. With Internet Explorer 7 open, click your cursor arrow on "Tools" in the then select "Internet Options" from the drop-down menu. The Internet Options window will open.
- STEP 2. In the "Home page" section of the "General" tab, you will see "To create home page tabs, type each address on its own line." Type in the website address (URL) that you want to open at startup. Press "Enter" and then type another address. Repeat until you have entered all the addresses that you want.
- STEP 3. Click on "Apply" and then "OK" to close the Internet Options window.
- STEP 4. Close and then restart Internet Explorer 7.

Using Web Browser Firefox 2.0 and Computer Operating System Windows XP SP2 Home Edition or Windows Vista Home Premium

- STEP 1. Open Firefox by clicking your cursor arrow on the "Start" button located in the bottom left corner of your desktop.

- STEP 1b. Select "Mozilla Firefox" from the list of programs. Your home page will automatically load.
- STEP 2. To open a new tab while keeping your current tab open, click on "File" in the menu bar and select "New Tab" from the drop-down menu.
- STEP 3. A second tab will appear labeled "(Untitled)." In the address bar, type in the website address of the site you want to visit. Both tabs will be visible.
- STEP 4. To close a tab, simply click on the red "X" located on the right side of the tab.
- STEP 5. Repeat steps 2 and 3 to open additional websites.


